ROCK SCHOOL NEWS

Hurray! National Register Plaque Dedicated



On March 10, 2017, BCPHS members, community members, former faculty and staff, students, and Tom Thurman, Yavapai County

Supervisor, gathered around and watched the unveiling of the plaque for the National Register of Historic Places mounted on the outside rock wall near the front door of the 1932 rock school building. Betty Hart and Audrey Erb did the honors. Betty is on the BCPHS and Beaver Creek School Boards and Audrey is a BCPHS member and the primary person responsible for writing and submitting the application.

Official word was received last fall that the 1932 rock school building was given the honor on September 20, 2016. The rock school was built after the former schoolhouse experienced not one but two fires. The rock school construction cost the ranchers and farmers in the school district \$2000.00. In order to raise money to pay back the loan, dances were held. The wonderful wood floor made a perfect dance floor. Men were charged \$1.00 and ladies were admitted free. The rock school was the only permanent structure on campus until 1972 when the metal classroom buildings were added. Only three other schools in Yavapai County are on the National Register: Mayer Red Brick School, Peoples Valley School and Clemenceau Public School in Cottonwood. In the Beaver Creek area the BC Ranger Station, Back Ranch Historic District- Montezuma Well Unit, and Sacred Mountain also appear on the register.



THE ROCK SCHOOL WILL BE OPEN TO THE PUBLIC FROM 10:00 A.M.-1:00 P.M. ON APRIL 8, 15TH, AND 22ND. EVERYONE IS WELCOME TO VISIT AND ENJOY THE EXHIBITS AND HISTORICAL INFORMATION.


